C

A new study suggests that head impacts(撞击) experienced during contact sports such as football and hockey may worsen some college athletes' ability to acquire new information.

The study involved college athletes at three Division I schools and compared 214 athletes in contact sports to 45 athletes in non-contact sports such as track, crew and Nordic skiing at the beginning and at the end of their season. The contact-sport athletes wore special helmets that recorded the force and other aspects of any head impact.



The contact-sport athletes experienced an average of 469 head impacts during the season. Athletes were not included in the study if they were diagnosed(诊断) with concussion(脑震荡) during the season. All of the athletes took tests of thinking and memory skills before and after the season. A total of 45 contact-sport athletes and 55 non-contact-sport athletes from one of the schools also took an additional set of tests of concentration, working memory and other skills.

^aThe good news is that overall there were few differences in the test results between the athletes in contact sports and the athletes in non-contact sports,^o says study leader Thomas W. McAllister. ^aBut we did find that a higher percentage of the contact-sport athletes had lower scores after the season on measures of new learning than the non-contact-sport athletes.^o

A total of 22 percent of the contact-sport athletes performed worse than expected on the tests of new learning, compared to four percent of the non-contact-sport athletes.

McAllister noted that the study did not find differences in test results between the two groups of athletes at the beginning of the season, suggesting that the **cumulative** head impacts that contact-sport athletes had incurred(遭受) over many

previous seasons did not result in reduced thinking and memory skills in the overall group. ^aThese results are somewhat reassuring(令人安心), given the recent heightened concern about the potential negative effects of these sports,^o he says. ^aNevertheless, the findings do suggest that repetitive head impacts may have a negative effect on some athletes.^o

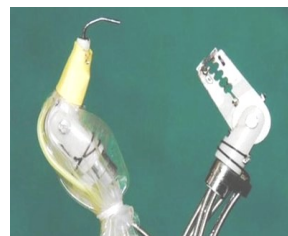
McAllister said it's possible that some people may be genetically more sensitive to head impact. The study was supported by the National Institutes of Health and the National Operating Committee on standards for Athletic Equipment.

Researchers have created a very small crab-like robot with a pincer(钳) and a hook that can remove early-stage stomach cancers without leaving any scars.

With an endoscope(内视镜), it enters the patient's gut(内脏) through the mouth. It has a pincer to hold cancerous tissues, and a hook that cuts them off and stops them from bleeding.



With the help of a tiny camera on the endoscope, the surgeon sees what is inside the gut and controls the robotic arms remotely while sitting in front of a monitor screen.

^aOur movements are huge, and if you want to make very fine movements, your hands will tremble¼ But robots can make very fine movements without trembling,^o said Lawrence Ho, who helped design the robot.

Professor Ho, who works at Singapore's National University Hospital, said the robot helped remove early-stage stomach cancers in five patients in India and Hong Kong, using much less time than is normally taken in surgeries(外科手术) that put patients at higher risk of infection and leave scars. Stomach cancer is the second

leading cause of cancer deaths worldwide and is particularly common in East Asia. Its treatment is difficult and often unsuccessful.

Louis Phee, a professor at Singapore's Nanyang Technological Institute School of mechanical and aerospace engineering, helped design the robot with Professor Ho.

They developed the robot after a seafood dinner in Singapore in 2004 with top Hong Kong surgeon, Sydney Chung, who suggested they fashioned their device after the crab. Dr. Chung is best known for fighting SARS in Hong Kong in 2003. "He suggested we used the crab as a prototype(样板). The crab can pick up sand and its pincers are very strong." Said Professor Ho. "Many things are a certain way because they have developed and adapted to certain functions¼ we borrowed ideas from nature."

The researchers formed a company last October and hope to make the robot commercially available in three years.

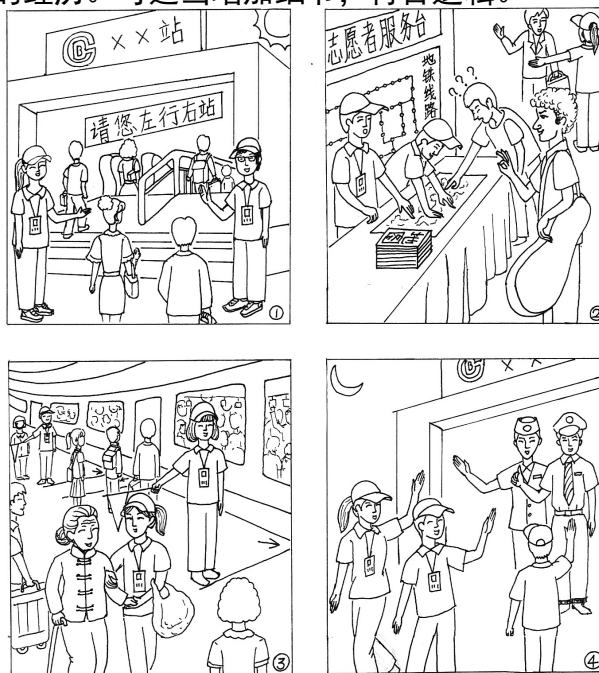
